Field Trip – Relevance to Curriculum

Field Trips should be designed and planned as one of an array of multiple and varied opportunities for students to gain and apply knowledge and understanding of contents, concepts and skills. Field Trips should be educational, academic experiences which:

1. Directly relate to the curriculum standards being taught;
2. Enhance learning;
3. Motivate and engage learners;
4. Enrich the curriculum;
5. Extend the learning;
6. Offer source of facts and new learning materials not immediately available in the classroom/school.

Field Trips – Safe and Valuable Experiences

In addition to the obligation to plan educationally sound field trips, is the serious obligation to ensure that all field trips are safe, secure, and viable learning experiences. Field trips should be designed and planned to:

7. Begin and end within the limits of the times that the children who are participating would usually be in session in school to ensure safety.
8. Avoid potential risks;
9. Include a well-planned schedule of events;
10. Meet the learning needs, development levels, and learning profiles of students;
11. Include accommodations and/or modifications for those in need.

Field Trip Proposal: Students will tour Munich, Prague, Brno, Budapest and Salzburg. Visit to Dachau Concentration Camp, discover architectural types, and learn about the cultural diversity of Habsburg Empire.

trip itinerary - 10 days

Apr 13, 2017: Overnight Flight

Depart from the USA.

Apr 14, 2017: Munich

Arrive in Munich, meet your ACIS Tour Manager and begin to explore the capital of Bavaria. Spend the afternoon exploring the green city on the banks of the Isar River; maybe choose one of the many excellent museums concentrated in the Kunstareal, or Art District, in the city center. (D)

Apr 15, 2017: Munich

The word Gemütlichkeit means coziness, hospitality, warmth and welcome. Dive right into this Bavarian way of thinking with an expertly guided sightseeing tour to sites like Marienplatz with its famed Glockenspiel, the Viktualienmarkt food and flower market and the surfers on the Isar River in the Englischer Gartens. In the afternoon, visit the Dachau Concentration Camp Memorial, a grim but important reminder of Germany's Nazi past. Later today, discover the city's hidden gems during a Munich by bike tour of unique neighborhoods and sights off the beaten path. (B,D)

Apr 16, 2017: Prague

Drive to beautiful Nuremberg to discover this city, notable centuries ago for its contributions to early astronomy and printing. View the Zeppelintribüne at the Nazi Party Rally Grounds, followed by a look at the Palace of Justice, where the infamous Nuremberg war trials were held from 1945 to 1949. Then visit the Nuremberg Documentation Center, a museum that provides socio-political context for the Nazi reign of terror, with audio guides. Continue on to lovely Prague, the capital of the Czech Republic. (B,D)

Apr 17, 2017: Prague

Prague is one of Europe's most beautiful cities as you'll see during a guided tour. A local expert will show us the quaint Malá Strana (Czech for "Lesser Quarter," named for its location at the foot of Prague's ancient castle) and the graceful Charles Bridge, built during the 14th century. We'll also visit the fortress-like Hradčany Castle complex, perched high above the city. This evening, we'll wander the checkerboard, cobblestone streets of the medieval Old Town to watch the street performers in the main square. (B,D)

Apr 18, 2017: Budapest

Leave Prague and stop briefly in Brno to see the medieval Špilberk Castle and Cathedral of Saints Peter and Paul. Continue into Hungary to Budapest, known as the Paris of Eastern Europe. (B,D)

Apr 19, 2017: Vienna

Explore Hungary's capital, which is made up of the hilly Buda district and flat Pest, split in two by the Danube. A morning guided sightseeing tour includes Castle Hill, Mathias Church and Heroes' Square. Then learn from a local chef about the art of strudel making and the ingredients used during a demonstration



of how to prepare these traditional flaky pastries before sampling the sweet results. Enjoy an afternoon drive across the Austrian border to the lovely city of Vienna. (B,D)

Apr 20, 2017: Salzburg

On our morning sightseeing tour of Vienna, an expert local guide shows you the glory of the former Imperial capital including the Ring, Hofburg Palace complex, Opera House and St. Stephen's Cathedral. Then gaze in wonder at the riches from the Habsburgs' sprawling empire as you tour the grounds and interior of Schönbrunn Palace. In the afternoon journey to Salzburg, known as the most musical of all Austrian cities. You may want to gain a bird's eye perspective of the Old Town by climbing Kapuzinerberg Hill for its panoramic views. (B,D)

Apr 21, 2017: Salzburg

See the enchanting sights of Salzburg on a guided sightseeing tour that will highlight many of the city's "Sound of Music" sites including the lovely, manicured gardens in front of the Mirabell Palace, the Sound of Music Churchyard and the stunning Baroque Dom Cathedral. Next, visit Mozart's Birthplace Museum on the crowded shopping street, the Getreidegasse. The afternoon is free to explore more at your own pace. Perhaps visit the Hohensalzburg Fortress, located 400 feet above the city center, or the collection at the Residenzgalerie. On your last evening in Europe, you might want to celebrate with cappuccino or hot chocolate at Café Tomaselli or ice cream from Icezeit in the Chiemsegasse. (B,D)

Apr 22, 2017: Departure

Depart for the USA. (B)
