

To Whom it may concern:

For purposes of providing cost breakdown for our educational programs it is very difficult to itemize these components as our programs include both tangible and intangible inclusions.

The tangible portions of the program are: Round trip transportation, all transportation in DC, all meals, all accommodations, complete sightseeing each day, as well as all meals and accommodations for chaperones and motor coach drivers, night chaperones from 10 pm until 5 am every morning, and all evening activities.

The intangible inclusions are: Liability insurance, comprehensive accident, medical and dental insurance coverage, Support Services (Tour Central available 24 hours a day), George Washington University Doctors on call, Discovery Journals and Educational components, Night chaperones at the hotels each night, On-Site Coordinators at the hotel, Full website for teacher, student and parent use.

What we are able to provide is an approximate percentage breakdown of the major tangible components (including the intangibles in the percentages) that make up the program cost. They are:

MOTOR-COACH (round trip and 10 hours each day while in DC): 30%

HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS – 27%

MEALS – 17%

SIGHTSEEING/ADMISSIONS/GRATUITIES/OTHER – 26%
