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Addressing Concerns of Schedule Unification at Hanover Middle School January 22, 2014

All Students Riding the Same Bus:

- I have previous leadership experience at a 5-8 middle school with all students bused together and I can anticipate potential challenges and issues.
- We currently work very closely with the bus company and will continue to do so even more to monitor behavior and routines. We recently met with all drivers to get their feedback to improve operations.
- Clear expectations will continue to be communicated to students that the bus ride is an extension of the school day and all rules/consequences are applied including harassment and bullying policies.
- Evaluate and incorporate a seating policy (i.e., 5th graders in front) and conduct spot checks on the bus.
- In the limited bus referrals we have had this year, our admin team has responded immediately and effectively.
- There are many successful times that we bring our school together and they are great opportunities for all students without incident.
- Opportunity to build leadership capacity with our older students. This has been a consistent message this year to our upper grade students leadership and positive role modeling and they have risen to the challenge.

Campus Operations:

- Currently our buses are not filled to capacity during either drop off or pick-up.
- 170-200 cars a day dropping students off is routine.
- I don't envision a significant increase in traffic given the current rate of drop off.
- Currently, between 7:00 and 7:30 many 5th and 6th graders are already being dropped off for various reasons older siblings at HMS or HHS, extra help, parent work schedules, etc.
- By the time the 5th and 6th grade buses arrive at 7:45 there is little traffic at the school
- Many of the vehicles in the traffic line between 7:00 and 7:30 are teachers who are on the second schedule and are often unable to get into their classrooms as early as they would prefer.
- On one schedule, all teachers would arrive and be out of the traffic pattern before student drop-off and arrival.
- One schedule will not increase the interactions of grades any more than it currently does.

Ongoing Evaluation:

- A school wide scheduling committee has been formed to look at current schedule and proposed one schedule model.
- We are researching examples from other 5-8 middle schools on one schedule.
- Parent forums are scheduled for the week of January 27th.
