### Field Trip - Relevance to Curriculum

1. Directly relate to the curriculum standards being taught;
2. Enhance learning;
3. Motivate and engage learners;
4. Enrich the curriculum;
5. Extend the learning;
6. Offer source of facts and new learning materials not immediately available in the classroom/ school.

### Field Trips - Safe and Valuable Experiences

In addition to the obligation to plan educationally sound field trips, is the serious obligation to ensure that all field trips are safe, secure, and viable learning experiences. Field trips should be designed and planned to:

7. Begin and end within the limits of the times that the children who are participating would usually be in session in school to ensure safety.
8. Avoid potential risks;
9. Include a well-planned schedule of events;

From the North: Rte. 95 S to exit 9 (left-hand exit) onto Rte. 4 S. Immediately exit at Rte. 401/East Greenwich. Right at light onto 401/Division St. One mile curve right onto First Ave. Turn right at light onto Main St. One-half mile at light, turn left onto Old Forge Rd. Old Forge becomes Ives Rd. One mile to park entrance on left. From the South: Rte. 95 N to exit 8A/Rte. 2 S. At first light, turn left onto Rte. 401 E/Division St. Follow directions above.

All entries will be submitted on-line. Entries will close on Sunday, September 19, 2021 at 5:00 PM. A list of schools competing in each race will be posted by Wednesday, September 22 at 9:00 PM.
