Field Trips – Safe and Valuable Experiences



In addition to the obligation to plan educationally sound field trips, is the serious obligation to ensure that all field trips are safe, secure, and viable learning experiences. Field trips should be designed and planned to:

7. Begin and end within the limits of the times that the children who are participating would usually be in session in school to ensure safety.
8. Avoid potential risks;
9. Include a well-planned schedule of events;
10. Meet the learning needs, development levels, and learning profiles of students;
11. Include accommodations and/or modifications for those in need.

Immersion trips to Málaga, Spain and to La Martinique, France (15 hours of language courses with homestay in a Spanish or French family)

Destinations: Málaga, Spain and La Martinique, France

Dates: 15th -23rd of February 2019

Anticipated number of students: about 20 Spanish students and about 12-15 French students

Anticipated number of chaperones (school staff): 4 (or more depending upon the number of students registered)

Cost to the student: about \$2,800

I- Benefits of an immersion program

There are many benefits participating in an immersion program. These benefits are:

a. Educational

- After traveling in another country, students have a **better understanding of different cultural and community perspectives**, and they develop more interest in global issues.
- Language acquisition happens through **practical immersion**. Applying their language skills outside the classroom in an authentic & immersive environment accelerates the language learning process and makes it more purposeful.

b. Personal

- Stepping outside their comfort zone, students develop **self-awareness** and insight into their own and return home more aware and curious about other cultures.
- **Independence & Resiliency:** Faced with the daily challenges of interacting in a different language and new cultural environment, students experience a

type of personal growth that can only happen away from the comforts of their home & school environment.

- **Self-confidence and self-esteem** are enhanced by the necessity to confront challenges outside a familiar support network and comfort zone.
- Students develop **life-long friendships**.

c. Practical

Students not only make new friends, improve their language skills, have fun, but they will also **enhance their college applications!**

So, here are the educational objectives of this program for our students:

Students will...

1. Investigate similarities and differences between French/Spanish and American Culture.
2. Bridge the gap between American and French/Spanish cultures by recognizing that our way is not the only way of thinking and by developing an appreciation for new perspectives.
3. Develop critical, creative thinking, and problem solving skills which will help students prepare for college entry in fields such as American Foreign Service, International Relations, the Travel Industry, the Arts, Humanities, Business Administration, Interpretation, Translation, Transportation Technologies, Law, Medicine, Sports, Aviation, and International Diplomacy.
4. Enhance their language skills through interpersonal/intrapersonal interactions in an authentic setting.
5. Learn about history of France and Spain.
6. Develop lifelong friendships.
7. Connect this learning experience with many facets of life.
