Superintendent Entry Plan Findings & Abrahams Report Update

- Review of Entry Plan Purpose and Process
 - Mr. Ferron discussed a few key words that were common in many of his interviews/discussions that he had with many people: community, accountability, sustainability and inspiration
 - Entry Plan Purpose- Learn Operations & Systems, Understand values and history, Identify strengths and challenges, Build relationships, Evaluate Abrahams findings and Develop Strategies
 - Entry Plan Process: Focus on Collecting Data: Conversations, Observations & Document Analysis
 - Entry Plan Findings: Core Strengths: A community that values education and expects excellent schools; Inspirational and committed faculty and staff;
 Overall high level of student performance and college acceptance
 - Entry Plan Findings: Primary Challenges: Curriculum alignment and equity; Communication and building trust; Budget transparency and sustainable funding; Training to support classroom based technology integration; Additional supports for special education; Increasing emotional and mental health concerns.
 - o Entry Plan Findings: Key Opportunities: Build and sustain collaborative teams to strengthen and improve PD, curriculum, technology, security and

student supports; Leadership team additions with expertise in curriculum implementation, Aspen SIS, etc.; Collaborative budget development identifies short and long term needs to assist with strategic planning; Timing of transportation contract allows for opportunity to align schedules at elementary and middle schools; Community support for full day Kindergarten; Supportive parent and community partners; MSBA moving towards approval for Center/Sylvester building project

- Abrahams Report Summary:

- Hanover has a great opportunity to strengthen its school system; Hanover must address some, if not all, of the recommendations in this report;
 Develop a learning community where the district established a vision, aligns curriculum and uses data as a source of improvement
- Leadership- Establish a District Vision; Align job descriptions with responsibilities; clarify lines of authority with curricular and instructional oversight; address culture and climate concerns in workplace
- Finance- Evaluate per pupil spending and town financial support for schools versus comparable districts; consolidate technology services with the town; increase communication and transparency regarding budget issues; utilizing Softright accounting system to increase effectiveness and eliminate redundancy
- Instruction-Increase communication and coordination which is ongoing;
 Effective alignment and equity of curriculum which is ongoing- including
 Vision 2020; Use of both data analysis and peer modeling/observation to improve instruction

- Near Term Goals:

- o Secure support for FY15 budget that accomplished near term goals
- Self sustaining full day Kindergarten program for FY15
- o Structure student transportation so that schedules can be aligned
- o Focused and equitable PD related to curricular alignment and resources
- o Increase district wide capacity using Aspen to support school-family communication
- Comment by Corbo that she is really pleased to see how far Hanover has come under the new administration with concrete progress in a short period of time
- Comment by Lynch- Plan goals are measurable and valuable and thoughtful-Question by Lynch regarding supporting students who are not attending four-year college? Mr. Ferron said that post secondary education is critical and he will seek the answers
- Comment by Phillips- have you seen improvement with teacher relations? Response by Mr. Ferron that he is confident that teachers know their messages are being heard
- Comment by Geary- Use of peer modeling/observation is a good idea but if there is a vulnerability there to not fully invest until everyone is comfortable- Response by Mr. Ferron that the trust must be there too for this to succeed and this should happen over time- there are some peer models being used now
- Public Comment by Joanne Collins- does the conversation regarding transportation include high school buses? Response by Mr. Rowe that the option is in there in the new bids to include high school buses; Also comment that will the 5-8th graders all be on the same bus? It would be a concern for her. Response by Mr. Ferron that it is being considered. Also comment regarding is Abrahams group independent of the

- town? Response by Mr. Marriner that the Abrahams group was hired independently of the town to give recommendations
- Jade Piccard- who is the main contact for Aspen? Have not been given current information on assessments/MCAS, last one posted was May 2012, should be made more efficiently. Response by Mr. Marriner that short -term gradebook is a priority but those issues are on the horizon.
