Economics is the study of how people and governments make decisions regarding money, production, consumption, and employment. Topics covered include the law of supply and demand, saving, borrowing, investing, and global trade.

This course is an introduction to both micro- and macro Economics. As such it is a fast-paced survey of terms, theories, graphs, and people. Upon completion of the course, students will understand terms such as labor, capital, inflation, unemployment, and money supply.

Students planning to major in business or students simply interested in their own financial futures should consider taking this class. Please note, Honors Economics is a challenging class and requires a higher level of commitment than a non-honors class. Homework, assigned almost each week night, includes readings, notes, and Crash Courses.
