

Non-High School Accountability Indicators

Massachusetts' new accountability system is designed to measure how a school or district is doing and what kind of support it may need. The accountability system considers:

Achievement	MCAS scores in English language arts, math, and science
Student Growth	Student growth percentiles in English language arts and math
	Four-year cohort graduation rate
High School Completion	Extended engagement rate (five-year cohort graduation rate plus the percentage of students from the cohort who are still enrolled)
	Annual dropout rate
Progress Towards English Proficiency	Percentage of English learners meeting annual targets in order to be English proficient in six years
Chronic Absenteeism	Percentage of students missing 10 percent or more of the days they were enrolled at a given school during a school year
Advanced Coursework Completion	Percentage of 11th and 12th graders completing advanced coursework (Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, dual enrollment courses, and other selected rigorous courses)

In 1993, the state established MCAS testing for all students in order to measure whether students are learning the material they need to know at each grade level. MCAS results:


- 1. help families see whether their children are making expected academic progress;





2018 Percentage of Students Meeting/Exceeding Expectations (Next-Gen MCAS)






2018 Percentage of Students with Disabilities Meeting/Exceeding Expectations (Next-Gen MCAS)




2018 Percentage of Students with Disabilities Meeting/Exceeding Expectations (Next-Gen MCAS)






2018 Percentage of Students Meeting/Exceeding Expectations (Next-Gen MCAS)






2018 Percentage of Student with Disabilities Meeting/Exceeding Expectations (Next-Gen MCAS)






2018 Percentage of Students Proficient/Advanced Expectations (Legacy MCAS)
