Time: Buses will depart Hanover Middle School at 2:45PM *sharp*, Cedar School at 3:00PM *sharp* and Center School at 3:15PM *sharp*. Students will be picked up at their respective schools unless previously arranged with staff. Students may bring equipment to school on the day of their lesson to be safely stored for the day. We will depart Blue Hills at approximately 6:00PM and will return to Hanover Middle School for pick up at approximately 7:00pm. A text alert will be sent to families through the Team App when departing Blue Hills Ski Area. All students must be picked up by a parent/guardian or other authorized designee.
