Dear Parents/Guardians:

In accordance with Massachusetts Department of Public Health (MDPH) regulations (105 CMR 200.400), the annual health screenings will take place on November 3-9. The following screenings will take place at Hanover High School

Hearing and Vision Screenings: Grade 2 & 3 Vision, Height, Weight Screenings: Grade 4

If your child wears glasses, please have them bring them to school.

Make-up screenings for those who missed or did not pass the initial screening will occur later in November.

If your child does not pass the vision or hearing screenings, you will be notified by your school nurse via school messenger. <u>If you prefer that your child not</u> <u>participate in the health screenings</u>, **you may opt-out by notifying your child's** <u>school nurse in writing</u>. Additional Information About Vision Screenings:

The Massachusetts Department of Public Health recommends that, in addition to the routine vision screening, a comprehensive eye exam by an eye doctor

experienced in treating children should be sought in the following cases:

- Children unable to complete, or who refuse to complete a vision screening
- Children whose disability or behavior prevents them from performing a standard screening
- Parent or teacher concerns about the student meeting academic benchmarks
- Children who receive additional educational support such as an Individualized Education Plan (IEP)
- Parent/guardian, teacher, nurse, or screener concern about the potential existence of a vision problem, even if the child has passed a recent vision screening
- If you have any concerns about your child's vision for any reason, please do not hesitate to schedule an appointment for a complete eye examination with a licensed ophthalmologist or optometrist.
