CEDAR ELEMENTARY SCHOOL Anne Thornton, Music Director

Hello from Cedar School Kindergarten and First Grade!

We are preparing for our annual Cedar School Holiday Concert. Our event will take place on December 11th for teachers, students, and staff, and on December 12th at 9:00 am for Kindergarten families and 10:15am for Grade 1 families. The children are enjoying the songs and working hard; the excitement is building!

Both Grades are working on various vocal explorations using all parts of their voices. We are looking at various chants from 1st Steps in Music, such as "The Ice Cream Sundae", "Big Pig", and "The Airplane Ride". During Halloween we looked at "On A Dark And Stormy Night." This Thanksgiving we are looking at echo songs such as the Natiive American "He, He, Wanna Wawate", and "Kye Kye Kule" from Africa. Both levels are working on the Prodigies series which explores the C Major scale with handbells as well as incorporating the corresponding solfege hand signs for each note name. Currently we are on "Say hello to our friend sol," the teal bell. We are exploring rhythms with "Sweet Beats" and the quarter rest using the white no color bell.

In Kindergarten we are continuing with beat and rhythm by using rhythm sticks, triangles and hand drums. We also are playing a guessing game called "beat or no beat!" We begin our class with "Wacky Warm Up" and "Music is Cool!"

Grade 1 warms up with "Bubble Gum Pop," our basketball shuffle Drill, and Ebeneezer Sneezer from the Young Voiceworks curriculum. We are looking at quarter and eighth notes as well as the quarter rest. Grade 1 just completed studying the tambourine and triangle and will be moving to other percussion instruments.

We are having a great time exploring various movement songs for the seasons and, we will learn a few holiday dances!




tunes you have not heard, as well as a few holiday favorites (and YES, you are invited to sing along).

Students in Grade 2 have been exploring the different ways they can use their voice to

have a conversation using puppets in our "Whale Talk" vocal exploration. Students take turns creating a sound like a "whale" and a classmate echos back the pattern.

The 27th Annual HMS Harvest Jam, featuring 8th grade students acting and performing on stage took place on Friday, Oct. 25th in the cafeteria. Students sang, rapped, danced, did gymnastics, and performed lip syncs while the staff recreated the Barden Bellas from "Pitch Perfect," and principal Birolini performed "Stairway to Heavern." To start things off, the HMS Performance Troupe performed "I Gotta Feeling" by the Black Eyed Peas and then finished the production with "Don't Stop Me Now" by Queen.

The 5th grade STAGE AND STUDIO TECH class has been very busy this fall working on Spirit Day, Veterans Day and Turkey Trot Assemblies as well as the Harvest Jam Production. The 6th graders in THE BROADWAY MUSICAL class, have been researching Broadway musicals from 1948 to now including the soon to open on Broadway "Six" which musically tells the story of Henry the 8th's six wives. The 8th graders in VIDEO PRODUCTION have been creating motion graphic pieces - some of which will be used in the Winter Jam in January.

Regular general music classes have just completed round 1 of RHYTHMWRITE. The 5th graders are also researching media technology over the last 140 years. The 6th graders are singing "We Didn't Start the Fire" by Billy Joel. The 7th graders are looking at recorded music over the last 100 years and the 8th graders are completing their Music Presentation video projects using IMovie, Garageband, ITunes and Motion.
