HANOVER HIGH SCHOOL AND MIDDLE SCHOOL CHORAL MUSIC

Welcome back, to all students and parents! The Hanover Choral Program is off and running, and we are so pleased with the level of dedication students are showing in just the first few weeks of school. The mission statement of the choral program is one of an accepting, open environment for every student; a place where peers can learn from and with each other, while creating beautiful music and a sense of community. Over the course of the year, our overarching focus will be on developing holistic musical literacy, where students become adept at creating, performing, and responding to music of all genres and styles. Students will hone skills in improvisation, composition, analysis, and performing, while also developing personal skills of perseverance, leadership, interpersonal communication, and artistic expression.

Outside of the choral program, there are additional opportunities for students interested in various aspects of the music field. Our Partnership in Music class is devoted towards the field of music therapy, and is comprised of a diverse population of students from throughout the high school. The goal of the class is to give musical experiences to students with special needs, and allow students from the general population leadership and teaching opportunities in a music class setting. Thanks to a grant from the Hanover Foundation for Educational Enrichment, students this year have access to a widened variety of percussive and melodic instruments, many of which are adaptable to the needs of our students, thus greatly expanding the capabilities of our classroom. Keep your eyes peeled for students from our class popping up around Hanover throughout the year!

We also have begun an exciting new instrumental class this year with the addition of Class Guitar! The class meets every other day for the year, with the purpose of developing students' capabilities on the guitar, all while tying in the personal goals of the student. Over the course of the year, students learn the fundamental skills required of playing guitar, including: melodic and chordal playing, strumming and fingerpicking patterns, tuning, music theory, sight-reading, improvisation, and ensemble skills. Whether the student be interested in learning the guitar for fun, writing their own songs as a singer-songwriter, taking part in a band, or becoming a classical guitarist, Class Guitar is the perfect low-stress introduction to the instrument -- no experience necessary!

Hanover continues to be a district dedicated to the support of its performing arts programs -- the mere existence of the above classes are evidence of this. We look forward to sharing a multitude of music with you over the course of the year, and hope you will join us at one of our many performances throughout the year!



HANOVER MIDDLE SCHOOL INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC

We welcome our newest band families to the instrumental music program! There were so many excited students at the rental night, and they are now getting started on their instruments. During these first few weeks, 5th graders will focus on instrument assembly, appropriate embouchure, posture, and sound production. At the first lesson, brass players focus on buzzing and woodwind players learn how to properly adjust the reed and assemble their instrument. Students are encouraged to play as much as possible.

Music students in all grades can enroll in private lessons with a professional on their instrument. This allows them individualized instruction, which is beneficial for all ages and levels. Students can get extra help during these beginner years, or for those that would like to move ahead, learn additional skills and music. The 6th Grade instrumental music students are starting the year as an ensemble, and have already demonstrated great teamwork and enthusiasm. The 7th/8th Band entertained students during the Spirit Day assembly on September 20. Their pieces included Lets Go Band, Feel It Still, Can't Stop the Feeling, We Will Rock You and Another One Bites the Dust. They will also begin preparing music for the Veteran's Day Assembly in November, and the December concert. The bands in grades 6-8 will present a Winter Concert on Wednesday, December 11 at 7:00pm. Auditions for Jazz Band are being held the week of September 25-30 and there are many interested students who are ready to give it a try! Instrumental music students in grades 7 & 8 were also invited to participate in a middle school band festival, hosted by Bridgewater State University. Students accepted to the festival will report to BSU on Thursday, October 3, rehearse all day with other middle school students from SE MA, and present a concert in the afternoon. It's a great experience to play with a different conductor, and meet other young musicians with the same interests.

Our exciting news for 7th & 8th Band is that they will have a performance at the State House, hosted by State Rep. David DeCoste. Performing at the State House has always been a very special experience for the HMS Band, and many former students have mentioned it as a middle school highlight. We will perform near the Grand Staircase, tour the State House, possibly visit the House of Representatives, and have a few more surprises! We are very pleased to offer this trip to our students and will provide updates once the February date is determined. Friends and family will also be welcome to meet us there and enjoy this special event.

The HMS Performance Troupe started out their year with a performance at the annual Spirit Day Assembly on Sept. 20th in the gym. They performed a special HMS version of Taylor Swift's "You Need To Calm Down" with lead vocals being sung by 8th graders Kaelyn Chase and Gianna Beer. They now are rehearsing for the 27th Harvest Jam which takes place on Friday, Oct. 25th.

The Middle School students have started their exploratory music courses at HMS. The 5th graders are participating in STAGE AND STUDIO TECH - learning about and getting hands on experience with set design, lighting design, sound design and all the elements that go into creating a stage or video production. The 6th graders are studying THE BROADWAY MUSICAL, a look at Broadway past and present. The 8th graders are in VIDEO PRODUCTION creating, directing, performing, editing and crewing pieces for HMS THIS WEEK and ANCHOR TV.

Regular general music classes are underway with RHYTHMWRITE happening in all four grades. Students are learning "rhythmic dictation" by both clapping and drawing musical notation!

I hope that this newsletter finds you well, and that you are adjusting well to the start of the new school year. Our young musicians have been busy at Center School, singing, dancing, saying, and playing. I hope they have been sharing songs and rhymes at home, but if not, here is a little update to share what we have been doing in the music room.

All of our musicians have been getting back into the swing of things in the music room. Every class we take the opportunity to listen to a new song, rhyme or chant, move to the beat, sing a familiar song or two, and explore the room through different movement activities. As we grow our song, rhyme, and chant collection, we will also be adding a variety of classroom instruments to play.



Students have been reviewing the song "Yankee Doodle," ensuring that our beats are all together, and our voices continue to grow more **Tuneful**. We have also worked on becoming more **Beautiful** by keeping the beat while listening to the music of Italian Baroque composers Arcangelo Corelli (Concerto Grosso In C, Allegro) and Antonio Vivaldi (Gloria - Domine Fili Unigenite). Students have become even more **Artful** while exploring creative movement with two movements from Camille Saint-Saëns Carnival of the Animals (1886): Tortues (The Tortoises), and Aquarium.

Thank you all for taking the time to read this, and for supporting our wonderful students and music program. I hope you will consider spreading the word about FHMT (Friends of Hanover Music and Theater) as we are always looking for new members. I am very excited to begin my third year teaching at Cedar School. This year is very exciting as Cedar School is now an early childhood pre-K-1 school! We are planning some exciting events and concerts throughout the year to give our students learning and performing opportunities.

Kindergarten students are beginning the year with vocal and pitch exploration. They will learn about the various pitch and non-pitched instruments in the room and begin singing games, movement songs, and rhythmic poetry. We are also beginning a music prodigies program with both grades playing color coded hand bells while learning the notes on the scale! Kindergarten will also perform songs for the holiday concert this December!

Grade 1 students are starting with name games that incorporate rhythms and movement. Singing game songs will be introduced weekly as well as games focusing on musical and rhythmic development. They will learn about music and composers from the 19th century through the roaring 20's decade. The children will also learn folk and international songs as well as music for our holiday concert.

The children will also continue with the First Steps in Music program which aligns with the Center grades 2, 3, and 4 levels.

I am looking forward to our very first new beginning at Cedar School with my new k and Grade 1 friends.

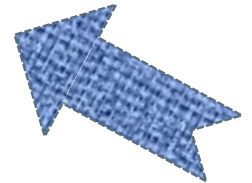
We're so excited for this year and all of the fantastic production that await us! Hope you've had a nice September so far! - the Drama Club E-board.
