## Why choose an alternative?

- Four-year college doesn't feel like the right fit for me
- I'm not ready to go to a four-year college
- I want to take some time off from school
- I want to pursue a career path that does not require four-year college
- I want to save money



#### What are the statistics?

- 61.8% of 2021 high school graduates nationwide were enrolled in four-year colleges or universities (U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics)
- In the class of 2021 at Arlington HS 15% of students did not plan to enroll in a four-year college after graduating (MA DESE)
- According to a 2017 study, 51% of Americans who pursued a four-year college degree had regrets about their higher education decisions



### What are my options?

- 2 year college
- Apprenticeships & Trade School
- Gap Year
- Military







## 2 Year College

- Often referred to as community college or junior college
- Excellent for saving money or boosting students' GPA
- MA state community colleges are part of the Mass Transfer Program
- Great for students who are interested in career training programs







## **Apprenticeships & Trade Schools**

- **Apprenticeships** are paid career-training programs where students learn on the job in addition to occasional classroom instruction
- **Trade Schools** give hands-on training in skills needed for specific careers
- Please see the HHS Counseling Office for a full list of trade schools and apprenticeship opportunities.
- **South Shore Technical School is offering FREE 13-week** training programs for seniors in good academic standing and recent graduates. See your counselor for registration information.
- Training programs include: HVAC, Automotive Technology, Horticulture and Landscape Design, Metal Fabrication and Welding.







### **Gap Year**

- Staying local, working, saving money for the next chapter
- Connecting with internships
- Service projects
- Travel opportunities





- Options for students in each military branch
- Recruiters work with students & families to discuss options and requirements
- Benefits include tuition assistance, housing, and job training
