## What does safe, respectful, and responsible behavior look like in our school?

In all learning spaces, students are expected to be		
Safe	Safe choices, calm and quiet body, stay in personal space	
Respectful	Be a kind friend, follow adult directions, take care of school property, use appropriate language	
Responsible	Be prepared to learn, respond to, and complete tasks	

In general, students are expected to behave in a way that promotes learning and does not interfere with teaching and learning. Teachers and students in each learning space set up rules and consequences that promote an optimum learning situation for all. Students who are reported for misconduct will speak with the teacher and/or principal. Parents/Guardians will be notified when deemed appropriate.

In the hallways, students are expected to be		
Safe	Walk and face forward, stay in personal space, keep hands to themselves	
Respectful	Smile, quiet wave, voices off	
Responsible	Stay to the right, walk in a line, stay with the class, and walk directly to their destination	

In general, students should be quiet, careful, and courteous in the halls. They should be considerate of classes that are in session and try not to disturb teachers and students who are working in classrooms.

On the playground, students are expected to be		
Safe	Take care of their body, take care of equipment, and play in a manner that will not cause harm to self or others	
Respectful	Include others, follow adult directions, be a kind friend, and respect others personal space	
Responsible	Take care of equipment and belongings, dress for the weather, follow the group plan, and report unsafe behavior	

In general, students are expected to abide by the rules of the playground, to cooperate with the teachers on duty (who are identified to the students) and to be considerate. Students who do not follow rules may be required to meet with the principal and an appropriate consequence will be determined.

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In the bathroom, students are expected to be		
Safe	Wash hands and keep floor dry	
Respectful	Flush, allow others their privacy, take care of school property, and use appropriate language	
Responsible	Throw away trash, and go directly back to class when done	

In general, students are expected to be safe, respectful, and responsible in the bathrooms. Negative interactions in the bathrooms can interfere with learning and create social problems in the classroom and school community.

In the cafeteria, students are expected to be		
Safe	Eat their own food, stay in their personal space, use walking feet, and stay in seats	
Respectful	Use appropriate table manners, include others, take care of school property, and follow adult directions	
Responsible	Line up quietly, take lunch they ordered, throw away trash, and take personal belongings	

In general, students are expected to abide by the rules of the cafeteria. Students who do not follow the rules may be required to meet with the principal and an appropriate consequence will be determined.

On the bus, students are expected to be		
Safe	Stay in seat, maintain a calm, quiet body	
Respectful	Quiet voices, be a kind friend, follow bus driver's directions, take care of the bus and use appropriate language	
Responsible	Keep food in backpack and report unsafe behavior	

In general, students should remember that the bus is an extension of the school. The same rules for good behavior, consideration, respect, and cooperation are always in effect. Students reported for misconduct on a bus may lose the privilege of riding on the bus for a period of time to be decided by the principal.
