
What is a SEPAC?



A SEPAC is a **S**pecial **E**ducation **P**arent **A**dvisory **C**ouncil. Every public school district in Massachusetts is required to establish a SEPAC. Massachusetts state law assigns both an advisory and participatory function to SEPACs and membership is offered to all parents and guardians of children with disabilities and other interested parties. The Special Education Parent Advisory Council's duties under state law include, "advising the school committee on matters that pertain to the education and safety of students with disabilities; meeting regularly with school officials to participate in the planning, development, and evaluation of the school district's special education programs." (Chapter 71B, Section 3, also known as Chapter 766. *available at* https://malegislature.gov/Laws/GeneralLaws/PartI/TitleXII/Chapter71B/Section3)

The Hanover SEPAC is an independent community organization which collaborates with district professionals and functions in an advisory role relative to special education issues. We strive to provide information and support to the special education community.
